Division of Vocational Rehabilitation

DVR offers a variety of employment services and supports for individuals who have a documented physical or mental disability. For example: Autism, Cerebral Palsy, Specific Learning Disability, Bi-Polar, Traumatic Brain Injury, and others.

- *Mission:* The Division of Vocational Rehabilitation (DVR) exists to serve its participants. Staff work as a team so participants can achieve their hopes and aspirations for meaningful employment through timely and individualized vocational rehabilitation services.
- VR Counselors advocate for consumers AND employers
 - Support to access and engagement in competitive, integrated employment
- Employment services vary and are unique to the individual consumer and employer:
 - Disability Awareness Training
 - Identifying Accommodations
 - Counseling/Guidance, Vocational Training, Job Related Services, etc.
 - Civil Rights Awareness

 - Limited field of vision




Invisible Disabilities


Student intern learning landscaping skills at a local hospital where he realized he prefers working indoors

Working with our partners, VR Counselors can offer a variety of opportunities to meet the needs of both the consumer and the employer

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DVR Contracted Providers (CRPs)

Easter Seals (Oahu, Hawaii, Kauai, Maui Islands): Vocational and Work Adjustment Training

Includes specific focus areas: food prep, customer service, clerical and janitorial. Training is a total of 40 hours. Duration of training will vary, depending on the skills of the client.

Evaluation and Training

Includes targeted evaluations and vocational skills training.

Lanakila Pacific (Oahu Island): Vocational and Work Adjustment Training

Includes formal and high school workshop classes offering personal development, interpersonal and vocational skill development as well as paid and unpaid work-based learning experiences.

Evaluation and Training

Includes targeted evaluations and vocational skills training.

<u>Abilities Unlimited (Oahu Island):</u> Vocational and Work Adjustment Training

Includes high school workshop classes, work readiness training, personal adjustment and technology skills, paid and unpaid workbased learning experiences, and job coaching services (JET, JUMPSTART, Work-Life Development, Summery Youth Employment Program).

Supported Employment

Includes work strategy assessment, job placement plan, job development, placement and job coaching supports to ensure maintenance of successful employment.

<u>Network Enterprises (Oahu Island):</u> Vocational and Work Adjustment Training

Includes: Paid Work Experience, Project Based Employment Skills, (PBEST Classroom), Goal Directed Community Integration Training (GDCIT), Job Specific Skills Training (JSTST), Career Explorations.

Areas: Soft Skills, Employment Skills, Career Development, Internships, Apprenticeships, and Community Mentor

<u>Arc of Kona (Hawaii Island)</u> Vocational Work Adjustment Training Services

Delivers pre-employment skills training at five public high schools to assist special education students prepare for their transition to work.

Supported Employment

Considered a "place, then train" program where all relevant issues are attended to in the employment phases. Training can include one-onone job coaching by The Arc of Kona's job coach and the participant's employer; specific work skills at the work site; ongoing counseling; social skills necessary to adjust to the work situation; and independent living skills.

<u>Ka Lima O Maui (Maui Island)</u> Vocational Work Adjustment Training

Provides classroom, facility and /or community training to increase a consumer's interpersonal skills relating to basic traits and attitudes. Individualized services provided are: series of pre-employment classes; in depth assessment of strengths, aptitudes, interest, values and attitudes; work experience.

Supported Employment

Services included but not limited to are: in depth assessment of strengths, aptitudes, interest, values and attitudes; development of resume, interview skills, job search; job placement, training and coaching; long term support.
